This upcoming week, they will help the young Fathers to run the boys camp and last week they were doing various jobs. It is all good exposure to all that is included in making a parish run. They have been a pleasure to have with us.

Fr. Ahern stopped by St. Gertrude's just for a couple hours on

Thursday enroute to visit his brother. While the visit was certainly a short one, it was very nice to see Father for a little bit and catch each other up on various points of goings on. We had thought Fr. Larrabee was going to be with us during the week as part of his own vacation, but he unfortunately had some flight trouble and decided that the frustration of flight delays and cancellations was too much to be bothered by during his time off and just remained in California. Hopefully he will be able to visit in the not-too-distant future.

Bp. McGuire returned late Monday night from his trip to Mexico. He reported a very good trip and visit with the priests down there and their respective parishes. However, he said that where Fr. Siordia is in Cocoyoc was particularly troubled currently by cartels and violence associated with their presence. There are many crosses on street sides, marking the places where recent murders have occurred and there have even been threats against Father's own life, as he is not shy in speaking out against the cartels. Some of the men from his parish stand guard around his property to protect him, but the threat is not absent. Fr. Siordia felt confident all would be fine for the Bishop's visit, and it was. However, he said if it gets any worse, he wouldn't risk having him come next year. Bp. McGuire said that when he asked Fr. Siordia if he was worried, Father said that he just simply prays and God protects him. He also said something about how God uses the animals, particularly the raccoons, to aid in his protection...I am not exactly sure what a raccoon would do to scare away narco gang members, but then again, the ways of the Lord are often mysterious. What I do know is that Fr. Siordia's confidence in prayer and Divine providence is most edifying. He knows his duties and performs them dutifully. He knows prudent steps to maintain safety and he utilizes them. The rest he prays and trusts God...truly beautiful. We should all join and pray for the safety of Fr. Siordia and his faithful.

## General Information

**Baptism:** By appointment. At least one parent as well as the sponsors must be practicing Roman Catholics who attend the Traditional Latin Mass exclusively.

**Confession:** Before Mass on Sundays, and other times as indicated in the weekly bulletin.

**Confirmation:** Solemnly administered periodically in the year and may be administered privately by request. Catholics who received confirmation in the post Vatican II rite (1971) should arrange to receive confirmation conditionally in the traditional rite.

**First Holy Communion:** Administered each year on the Sunday after Corpus Christi. Adequate knowledge of the catechism is required.

**Matrimony:** If you are contemplating marriage, please make an appointment to speak with a priest before you set a date. At least one of the parties must be a practicing traditional Catholic and member of this parish. Weddings are forbidden during Advent and Lent.

**Communion for the Sick:** Please contact the pastor or coordinator when a church member is hospitalized or too ill to attend Mass.

**Extreme Unction:** Do not put off making arrangements until the last moment, but contact the pastor or coordinator promptly if a church member is gravely ill or in danger of death.

**Decorum in Church:** Respect for God in the Blessed Sacrament requires a reverent silence. Please turn off cell phones and keep children well behaved. Both young and old should wear dignified and modest clothes in church, and women should wear a dress or skirt, and a veil or hat. Veils are available in the vestibule. Men should wear shirt and tie as well as a jacket or sweater.

**Holy Communion:** Only baptized practicing Catholics in the state of grace may receive Holy Communion. You must be fasting:

- Three hours from solid foods and alcoholic beverages.
- One hour from other liquids.
- Water may be taken at any time.

The communicant kneels at the communion rail, and receives the Blessed Sacrament on the tongue. The communicant does not say “Amen” after the priest says “*Corpus Domini nostri Jesu Christi custodiat animam tuam in vitam aeternam. Amen.*”

**Singing:** The faithful are invited to join in singing any hymns preceding or following the Mass, but only the choir sings during the course of the Mass.
